

# SAMUEL C. BASS DIES AT UTICA

## Death Occurred Early Saturday—Was in Business Here Many Years

Boonville friends learned with deep sorrow of the passing of Samuel C. Bass, 81, former well known resident of this village, Saturday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Chas. Dennis,, 806 Newell Street, Utica. He had been in poor health for the past year.

Mr. Bass was born in Boonville July 8, 1848, son of Dr. Charles N. and Juliette Burnham Bass. As a boy he attended Clinton Liberal Institute and later continued his education at a private school in Geneva. For several years Mr. Bass was engaged in the pharmacy business in Boonville under the name of Tharratt & Bass.

After retiring from that enterprise Mr. Bass became a traveling representative for Bristol & Myers of Brooklyn, retiring from that position in 1913.

He married the late Jennie M. Owen, January 27, 1875, and she died April 21, 1920. The family then moved to Utica where Mr. Bass had since resided. In Boonville he was a member of Trinity Episcopal Church and in Utica attended Grace Church.

He loved Boonville and our people. A true gentleman and friend has joined those on the other shore.
